GLOBAL GRANTS

Vocational Training Teams are eligible for Global Grant support and a wonderful example of this is the team that studied "Prevention and Reduction of Substance and Alcohol in PNG & SI".

Starting with running conferences of 20 people in each of Honiara and Port Moresby, the team went on to visit local community organisations and hospitals to meet with sufferers and their carers and treatment professionals for observation of analysis and discussion.

This dedicated team of professional from Netherlands conducted training and education for local professionals and carers and continued to produce research reports following their return home.

Sixty local professionals were trained in new operational procedures and continual contact and training continues 3 years on.

The cost of the project was over KINA \$136,000 but the real benefits with so much expertise given for no remunerate and continuing to provide successful results is so much greater.



DISTRICT GRANTS

1) The Rotary Club of BULOLO/ WAU used AUS \$7,500.00 with a grant of AUS \$3,500.0. To build a new student toilet, shower and laundry ablution block for The Bulolo Technical School.

With students attending from all over the Morobe Province. It provides a safe and clean environment which greatly assists by providing them a good atmosphere to live and study thus helping them to concentrate and enjoy school work and study.

The club has members who are teachers and employees of different fields related to this project and engaged to actually build his project. They also got plumbers, bricklayers, welders, carpenters and painters and managers to commit their time to this project.

The project was estimated to cost K\$15,000 which is equivalent to AUS\$7,500. 40% of the clubs members are heavily involved in the school and therefore the school will meet most of the machinery and the members will engage labour form the students in the related fields/ areas to provide a labour for the project.

2) LifeStraw water filtration units for wards in the Nauru hospital was a project of the Buderim Club with \$1,250 grant for a total of \$2,500. As all water on Nauru needs to be boiled, patients are encouraged to bring their own water when they are admitted to the hospital, which can be quite difficult at times. Therefore this project aids in disease prevention and treatment

The provision of water filtration units in each ward assists with the nursing care and recovery of the patients.

HOW TO REACH OUR TARGET OF \$500,000 (USD)

1,215 Centurions x A\$100 = \$90,000 from members 50 x PHS = \$50,000 from members

Major Donors = \$40,000 from individuals 60 Clubs x \$4,000 average = \$240,000 from clubs

302 members x US\$26.50 = \$80,000

TOTAL = \$500,000

MEET DANIEL CASTANHEIRA

Rotary Peace Fellow

Daniel Castanheira was born in João Pessoa, the capital of Paraiba, a small state in the northeast of Brazil. While being a region rich in natural resources and with breathtaking landscape, it is also a region where basic services are inaccessible, social and income inequalities are stark, and communities are consistently affected by droughts. Within this context, he developed a great commitment to social justice. In 2011, Daniel started to volunteer at a local NGO that aims to promote and protect rights inherent to citizenship, especially those of children and adolescents, the disabled and elderly. He started providing free legal counselling and assisting in organizing capacity-building courses to officers of the Guardianship Councils. In 2015, Daniel was appointed Treasurer of the NGO and a member of the NGO's Board. Through his experience at the community level, Daniel developed a profound desire for his work to have a more global impact. After four years of private practice, he left his career as a lawyer and through a

practice, he left his career as a lawyer and through a scholarship from the Brazilian Government, undertook a Masters in International Relations graduating in 2015. The research he conducted within the program developed his interest in the protection of conflict displaced populations. After completing the Master's program, he interned with the Protection Unit of UNHCR's office in Brasília. Additionally, during his time in Brasília and before coming to Australia, he worked as a Protection Assistant at the Institute of Migration and Human Rights, one of the organizations that represents Brazilian Civil Society at the National Committee for Refugees (CONARE). As a Protection Assistant, he worked with Refugee Status Determination procedures, specifically by conducting interviews with asylum-seekers, preparing advisory opinions on their eligibility for Asylum and presenting their cases at CONARE's meetings.
